School No. 22 was founded in 1990, being organized in the form of classes in the hospital. So, at this moment, in Sibiu county, there are classes in every children's hospital, depending on the medical problems which they have.

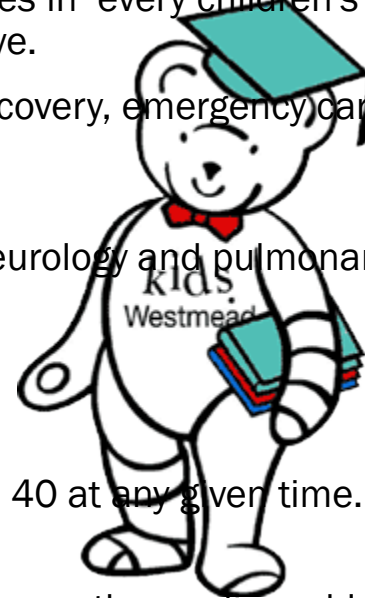
School No. 22 has a preventoria character, physical or mental recovery, emergency care and prevention of school abandonment.

School No. 22 has, at present, the following structure:

- Six groups of preschoolers in recovery wards, psychiatry, neurology and pulmonary diseases
- 4 primary school classes
- 4 classes for secondary school

Up to 300 children attend the Hospital School every year, about 40 at any given time.

The children tend to need treatment and care for such conditions as orthopaedic problems, burns, asthma, infectious diseases, neurological and psychiatric problems. They can attend school in their ward or classrooms and can be enrolled from one day to many months.



A SPECIAL KIND OF TEACHER

Our teachers need to have an incredibly positive outlook, and the professionalism to support families in crisis.

Hospital teachers meet a lot of sick children and hear a lot of sad stories, but despite this they continue to instil hope in the child and their family.

With their focus not only on curriculum, the teachers help students get through one of the most difficult times of their young lives."

Julieta Toma, one of the teachers says her job is challenging, rewarding, uplifting and emotional.

"When one of your students sees you and smiles, you know that in some small way you have brought a bit of happiness into that child's life," she says.

"When a student finally go home, I miss them, but I know they are where they belong.

"Being a small part of them getting well again, that is my reward."



OUR HOSPITAL TEACHERS

Our teachers are highly qualified, with previous classroom experience. They are trained in a variety of areas including elementary, middle, high school and special education, providing quality educational support to our child patients.

Our hospital teachers can help children :

Work with them, so they don't fall behind. This includes:

- Coordinating assignments with children's teacher(s)
- Providing instruction
- Sending progress notes to their school to show attendance and assignment completion

Learn about support and resources available at each child's school, including assistance through an Individualized Education Plan.

Provide information to each child's school about how his illness may impact his learning.

Make referrals for home instruction if the child's doctor says that he is too sick to go back to school for a period of time.



SCHOOL AT OUR PEDIATRIC HOSPITAL

School is a big part of every child's life. When a child's life is interrupted by an illness or a hospital stay, it is important that he continues with as many normal activities as possible.

The School Program supports the educational needs of patients whose medical condition impacts their learning experience. All services are free to patients.



WHAT IS HOSPITAL SCHOOL LIKE?

HOSPITAL SCHOOL IS PROBABLY QUITE A LOT LIKE YOUR NORMAL SCHOOL - YOU WILL FIND THE USUAL THINGS THAT YOU ARE USED TO.

BUT THE STAFF WILL UNDERSTAND YOUR MEDICAL CONDITION AND WON'T MAKE YOU DO TOO MUCH IF YOU ARE ILL OR RECOVERING FROM SURGERY. IF YOU ARE A LONG STAY OR RECURRING VISIT YOU ON THE PATIENT TEACHERS WILL NORMALLY VISIT YOU ON THE WARDS FOR UP TO AN HOUR A DAY IF YOU ARE NOT WELL ENOUGH TO GO TO THE SCHOOLROOM



One of the main aims of the Hospital School is to help children in hospital to keep in touch with their own local schools as well as with everyday life.

HOW MANY PEOPLE WILL BE IN MY CLASS?

There could be just a couple or there might be a small group of five to 10. Everyday is different and so it is difficult to be exact.



Do all Romanian children's hospitals have schools and do they teach work from the National Curriculum?

Not all **hospitals** have a school and dedicated schoolroom facilities but quite a few now have **teachers** working on the wards and there may be areas for quiet study. The National Curriculum is normally followed where appropriate but hospital schools can deviate from it if they need to.
