# Art Therapy for Children in Short-Term Hospitalization

**Author: Meirav Hen (Israel)** 

### **Abstract**

Pediatric hospitalization is known to be associated with adverse developmental and psychosocial outcomes for young patients. Art therapy is a direct means of addressing the emotional world of the hospitalized child. However, the hospital setting sometimes requires adaptations of this practice to a short-term mode. To explore the characteristics of the adjusted short-term art therapy mode, 10 experienced art therapists who work with hospitalized children were interviewed. Results highlighted the unique aspects of working with children who enter short-term hospitalization, addressing the unknown but most likely brief duration of art therapy and the issues involved, such as the need to use problem-focused strategies, the diffused therapeutic space, interaction with a multidisciplinary staff, and parent's presence during the therapy session. Integrating the principles of art therapy with the principles of short-term therapy, this paper explores a model for carrying out short-term art therapy with children undergoing short hospitalization.

## Emerging Frameworks in Health and Education: Conceptual Evolution in Pursuit of School-Based Health

Authors: Daniel Skinner (USA), Hannah Palmer (USA), Sara Bode (USA) and Mary Kay Irwin (USA)

### **Abstract**

This paper presents a historical account of the development of key concepts at the intersection of American education and health. Beginning with early advancements from the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development and the World Health Organization, the authors show the movement from early considerations of the codependency of health and education, as well as educational revisions of more-familiar "social determinants of health" frameworks, culminated more than fifty years later, with the 2014 introduction of "Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child" (WSCC). At the same time, the authors show that the trajectory of this movement, consisting of efforts to work through differences in how institutions and experts approach health and education, was far from linear, consisting instead of fits and starts. In addition to explaining why WSCC is in many ways a critical revision of social determinants models that serves today as a promising foundation of American school-based health, the authors examine opportunities and challenges that the pivot towards WSCC presents, especially concerning assessment, funding, and collaboration.



And that was often celebrated.




As Vice President I had a lot of support from Anja.

## 14/ Word of thanks to Michel Kleuters





You travelled extensively through Europe for HOPE. On the road, in style.










Look at all these posh brands I found with the name Ambassador.
